## Works in Progress

**Love Inqueeries (working title)** is a hybrid documentary gameshow about two marginalized queer women (bi and ace) in developement with Soft Cage Productions.

**Queer Christians** is a feature-length hybrid documentary that melds character-based verite documentary with experimental filmmaking. It is raw, poetic meditation on the lives of three Christian lesbian women of color untangling how they define themselves from how their communities define them. *Queer Christians* is the recipient of NeXt Doc's inaugural Flex Fund.

*Untitled Gordon Quinn Documentary* is a short documentary that turns a veteran filmmaker into a film participant. The film peels the curtain on documentary pioneer and Kartemquin Films co-founder, Gordon Quinn as he navigates life, battles COVID, and contemplates his legacy. The project is made through Red Door Media Collective, a five person trans-state collective of underrepresented emerging filmmakers.

**Green Card Lottery** is a feature-length personal documentary following the trajectory of a Cameroonian immigrant's journey in France and the United States. It pulls from the personal archives of the filmmaker and her mother. *Green Card Lottery* is the recipient of Northwestern University's Office of International Program Media Arts Grant.

Vilify Media Podcast is an informtaional podcast where host Elodie Edjang has transparent conversations with documentary insiders to aid others along their creative journeys. Recent interviewees include Diane Moy Quon (Minding the Gap, Finding Yingying), Angelo Madsen Minax (North by Current), and Cyril Aris (The Swing).

# **Completed Works**

**Book of Daniel (2018)** is a short documentary following an isolated South Sudanese refugee living in Chicago. Daniel enters his home during late hours of the night after having worked a long shift. We learn that Daniel is a painter with an affinity for religious paintings. In addition to practicing faith through painting, Daniel creates his own church by watching Bible DVDs as he attentively follows along. By way of another painting it is revealed that Daniel grew up in a refugee camp in Kenya. Not only are the paintings a way for Daniel to practice his faith, they function as a therapeutic and biographical tool. With films and religious text being one of the few windows out of his studio apartment, it becomes apparent that Daniel's new life in the United States has not been easy. He witnessed the murder of his family and left the only home he knew behind. Though he finds solace in the films, remnants of his wounds appear as prolonged violence on the screen become hard to bare. Through our limited time with Daniel we learn how art and faith are tools that help some overcome unbearable loss but also how easily people can exist in the shadows of the world. *Book of Daniel* world premiered at Tacoma Film Festival (2018) and screened at the Block Cinema (2018) and the Gene Siskel Film Center as a selection for the 2019 Black Harvest Film Festival.

**Divided (2018)** is a fragmented interactive media piece that explores colorism in the Black community. Colorism uplifts and rewards people with skin color and features with proximity to whiteness. These standards of beauty not only affect self-image but have real economic consequences. Not only do external or periphery communities uphold these barriers but the internalized ideals of white supremacy (passed through media, socialization, etc.) are then reinforced by people of color. This creates a divide. Colorism, particularly in rap music also objectifies and hyper-sexualizes lighter skinned women, placing high value in their physical appearance and seldom acknowledges other qualities of value they may possess which further shapes a

woman's self-worth. *Divided* appropriates popular rap songs containing lyrics that describe lighter skinned Black women. The term *redbone* is slang used by men to describe a lighter skinned, typically "attractive" Black woman. In this iteration of the work two stock images, a dark skinned Black woman and a light skinned Black woman, are juxaposed to showcase the misogynoir that occurs within colorism. On the darker skinned woman, negative depictions of Black women in television and film are overlaid (i.e trite slave films, reality tv fights, etc.). The lighter skinned woman recites the lyrics which are then intercut with the source material. *Divided* is one of three films to be nominated by Northwestern University faculty to apply for the 2018 Hyde Park Exhibition, an annual showcase of top Chicagoan MFA talent.

The Days Are Growing Longer (2018) features women performance artists as they float on a bed of appropriated poetry written by satirist Marietta Holley. This experimental short mixes 16mm in camera effects with digital post effects to build upon the concept of collage as trans-temporal collaboration. The film screened at the Dittmar Gallery in 2018.

*Mami Makala (2018)* is a slice of life short documentary featuring Martine, a street vendor in Cameroon. *Mami Makala* was made possible through the support of Northwestern University's Office of International Program Media Arts Grant.
